## 2018 Queensland Championship Supplementary Information

#### Free Entry:

Free entry will be granted to GM/WGM and IM/WIM as well as players rated over ACF 2200 on either the June or September 2018 classical ratings list.

The highest scoring local player from each regional tournament will receive: Free entry to the 2018 QLD Championships, as well as \$400 stipend to assist with accommodation and travel costs (receipts need to be shown to Championships committee).

A 'local player' is defined as a person having resided in that locale for a minimum of 90 days prior to the qualifying event.

Regional events are classified as: Bundaberg, Mackay (Stephen Solomon), Townsville (Mark Vucak), Cairns (David Spuler).

The 2018 QLD Reserves winner (Matthew Al Canafe) and the 2018 Queensland Junior winner (Hughston Parle, Henry Slater-Jones, Sravan Renjith), whilst not having free entry, receive the right of entry should they wish to play.

#### Special Consideration for players rated under ACF 1700 or FIDE 1800.

Players who are rated under ACF 1700 or FIDE 1800 and wish to play in the 2018 QLD Championships may apply in writing to the organising committee via email—afitzpatrick@gardinerchess.com.au. The committee (CAQ President Mark Stokes, CAQ Vice President Andrew Fitzpatrick, and Junior Development Officer Shaun Curtis) will then decide the merits of allowing the player into the tournament. The application must include evidence as to playing strength, including recent form and results that is in line with the regular over ACF 1700 cut-off.

Players who may not meet the over ACF 1700 or FIDE 1800 criteria or not be deemed eligible by the committee will form a reserves list based on their ACF rating. Should there be an odd number of players in the 2018 QLD Championship field, the highest ranked player will be invited to take part in the event.

### 2018 Queensland Championship Final Conditions:

- 1) The deadline for entries will be Wednesday 26th September.
- 2) Provisional Pairings will be published immediately following this, and subsequently will be made available each evening after the conclusion of the days play (these will be in provisional format until 30 minutes prior to the round the next morning).
- 3) Up to 2 x half point byes may be taken during the first 7 rounds of the event. Byes must be advised prior to the start of the previous round.
- 4) In the event of a tie for first place, the title shall be shared.
- 5) The title of Queensland Champion may only be won by a Queensland resident.
- 6) Mobile phones (and other electronic devices) are not permissible to be on a persons body during their game. Devices must be switched off and placed in bags or handed to the arbiter (who will have storage bags) prior to the beginning of each round.
